The Headless Way

Our fellowship is hosting a very special event for the community—a daylong workshop with Richard Lang titled **The Headless Way**. The program is based on a method of self-enquiry pioneered by Douglas Harding.



"Over the past sixty years a truly contemporary and Western way of 'seeing into one's Nature' or 'Enlightenment' has been developing. Though in essence the same as Zen, Sufism, and other spiritual disciplines, this way proceeds in an unusually down-to-earth fashion. It claims that modern man is more likely to see who he really is in a minute of active experimentation than in years of reading, lecture-attending, thinking, ritual observances, and passive meditation of the traditional sort. Instead of these, **The Headless Way** uses a variety of simple, non-verbal, fact-finding tests, all of them asking: how do I look to myself? They direct my attention to my blind spot - to the space I occupy, to what's given right here at the Centre of my universe, to what it's like being 1st-person singular, present tense."

A committee headed by Charles Smith, board treasurer, will begin a search for a new "home" for the Fellowship. Volunteers are welcome.

Several members' complaining of respiratory distress in the Dolphin Playhouse, which under the best of conditions is dusty, precipitated the need for new quarters. The committee will review the Fellowship's resources, speak to real estate brokers and bankers, investigate nonprofit grants – including

City of Coos Bay funds for locating in Empire – and solicit support from the Unitarian Universalist Association and the Pacific Northwest District.

Discussion by the board at its Sept. 24 meeting included the possibility of finding quarters that could include revenue-producing retail and/or residential space. In any case, needs include restrooms, a kitchen, a suitable meeting space, a separate Religious Education room, and adequate parking.

The SCUUP Newsletter Archive

We are digitally archiving the full SCUUP newsletter collection from the first issue in 1991 to this edition (so far!). To date, we've collected 216 documents covering 250 months of program. Almost every edition of this newsletter—from even before it was called The SCUUP—has been converted to digital format, but we're missing a few.

The archiving effort is in preparation for our 25th anniversary celebration. We'll be using the collection to help us discover some of our history. If you enjoy local history and would like to contribute to the archiving effort, please contact archivist Mark Stueve (below).

Many members contributed to the collection. Mitzi Loftus had editions from the very early years of the fellowship, Al Solomon and Mark Stueve had scores of digital pdfs already to share. Jean Adamson had most of the collection sorted in hard copy. Mark prepared the documents for publication. The early editions were scanned into pdf files. The newer editions are already fully digital.



There are some holes in the collection and we are still trying to fill them (if they ever existed to begin with). If you have old editions and can help, please contact the archivist. Specifically, we are looking for some of the SCUUPS from 1991 – 1993, late 1995 – early 1996, January and February 2008, and some in 2009 and 2010.
